To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

THEREAS our loving Subjects JOHN WATTS, WILLIAM SMITH, ROBERT R. LIVING-STON, WHITEHEAD HICKS, WILLIAM LIVINGSTON, GOLDSBROW BANYAR, and SAMUEL JONES, of our City of New-York, Efquires; PETER VAN BRUGH LIVINGSTON, and PETER KETELTAS, of our faid City of New-York, Merchants; WALTER RUTHERFURD, and DAVID CLARKSON, of our faid City of New-York, Gentlemen; and SAMUEL BARD, of our faid City of New-York, Physician, --- by their humble Petition presented unto our trusty and well-beloved WILLIAM TRYON, Efquire, our Captain-General and Governor in Chief, in and over our Province of New-York, and the Territories depending thereon in AMERICA, Chancellor and Vice-Admiral of the fame; and read in our Jouncil for our faid Province on the eighth Day of September mit; did fet forth, That fundry Persons conceiving a public Library would be useful as well as ornamental to our said City of New-York, did in the Year of our Lord One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Fifty Four, fet on Foot a Subscription in order to promote the Defign of erecting one in our faid City, and did thereby promife to pay FIVE POUNDS New-York Currency, each, on the first Day of May in the faid Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Four; and TEN SHILLINGS yearly, each, on every first Day of May for ever thereafter, to twelve Trustees to be chosen by the Majority of the Subscribers, or their Assigns, annually, out of the Number of Subscribers thereto, or their Affigns: For which Purpose the faid Subscribers did thereby agree to meet constantly on the last Tuesday in April in every Year, at the EXCHANGE in Broad-Street, in our faid City of New-York, between the Hours of eleven and twelve. Which Trustees, or the Majority of them, were thereby empowered to dispose of the said Money in purchasing such Books as they should think proper from Time to Time, and in procuring a House or Room to deposit them in ; to appoint a Librarian, and allow him a proper Salary for his Care and Attendance

Attendance of the faid Library; to regulate the Terms on which the Books belonging to the faid Library should be lent, and to do every Thing they should judge necessary to erect, preferve, ornament and improve the faid Library. That the Monies fubscribed as aforefaid, amounting to Six Hundred Pounds, current Money of New-York, together with fo much of the annual Payments as could be collected, had been applied according to the Terms of the faid Subscription : By which Means the faid Library was become very confiderable, but would increase much faster, and might be made of greater publick Utility if a Corporation should be formed for that Purpose. And therefore the Petitioners, being the present Truftees of the faid Library, humbly prayed our Letters Patent, forming a Corporation for the Purposes aforesaid. Now we taking into our Royal Consideration the beneficial Tendency of fuch an Institution within our faid City, are graciously pleased to grant the said humble Request of our faid loving Subjects. KNOW YE THEREFORE, That we of our especial Grace, certain Knowledge and meer Motion, have willed, given, granted ordained, conflituted and appointed, and by these Presents, do will, give, grant, ordain, constitute and appoint, That the said JOHN WATTS, WILLIAM SMITH, ROBERT R. LIVINGSTON, WHITE-HEAD HICKS, WILLIAM LIVINGSTON, GOLDSBROW BANYAR, SAMUEL JONES, PETER VAN BRUGH LIV-INGSTON, PETER KETELTAS, WALTER RUTHER-FURD, DAVID CLARKSON, and SAMUEL BARD, JOHN CRUGER, JAMES DUANE, RICHARD MORRIS, PHILIP LIVINGSTON, LAMBERT MOORE, JAMES JAUNCEY, ROBERT R. LIVINGSTON, Jun. HENRY HOLLAND, LEONARD LISPENARD, JOHN MORIN SCOTT, ELIAS DESBROSSES, AUGUSTUS VAN CORTLANDT, RICHARD NICHOLLS, and PETER VAN SCHAACK, all of our faid City. of New-York, Esquires; George Duncan Ludlow, of Queen's County, Efq; Robert Living flon, of the Manor of Living flon, in the County of Albany, Esq; the Reverend Samuel Auchmuty, of our faid City of New-York, Doctor of Divinity, John Troup, of Jamaica in Queen's County, Esquire; Abraham Brinckerhoff, William Robinson, Isaac Low, John Hunt, Theophylael Bache, Gerard W. Beekman, Mattathias Gomez, William Ludlow, Humphrey Jones, Gerard G. Beekman, David Van Horne, Lawrence Reade, John Living Ston, Laurence Kortright, John Alsop, William Kelly, William Walton, Peter T. Curtenius, Henry Remsen, Jun. and Gerrit Abeel, all of our faid City of New-York, Merchants; Guliam

Ver Planck, Thomas Barclay, Jun. and Abraham De Peyster, all of our faid City of New-York, Gentlemen; John Wiley and Toleph Greswold, of our faid City of New-York, Distillers; Hugh Gaine, of our faid City of New-York, Printer; William Brownjohn, of our faid City of New-York, Apothecary; Peter Renaudet, Surgeon; and Anne Waddel, of our faid City of New-York, Widow: Being fuch of the Subscribers to the faid Library, or their Assigns, as have not only paid the faid Sum of Five Pounds, but also the said Ten Shillings yearly, ever fince; and fuch other Persons as shall be hereafter admitted Members of the Corporation hereby erected, be, and for ever hereafter shall be by Virtue of these Presents, One Body Corporate and Politic in Deed, Fact and Name, by the Name, Stile, and Title of THE TRUSTEES OF THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY. And them and their Successors by the same Name, We do by these Presents, really and fully make, erect, create, constitute and declare, One Body Politic and Corporate, in Deed, Fact and Name, for ever; and will, give, grant and ordain, that they and their Successors, THE TRUSTEES OF THE NEW YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, by the fame Name, shall and may have perpetual Succession; and shall and may by the same Name, be Persons capable in the Law to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, defend, and be defended in all Courts and elfewhere, in all Manner of Actions, Suits, Complaints, Pleas, Causes, Matters and Demands whatfoever, as fully and amply as any other our liege Subjects of our faid Province of New-York. may or can fue or be fued, implead or be impleaded, defend or be defended by any lawful Ways or Means whatfoever: And that they and their Successors by the same Name, shall for ever hereafter be Persons capable and able in the Law to purchase, take, hold, receive and enjoy to them and their Successors, any Messuages, Tenements, Houses and real Estate whatsoever; and all other Hereditaments of whatsoever Nature, Kind or Quality they be, in Fee-Simple, for-Term of Life or Lives, or in any other Manner howfoever : and also any Goods, Chattels, and personal Estate whatsoever: provided always the clear yearly Value of the faid real Estate. doth not at any Time exceed the Sum of One Thouland Pounds Sterling, lawful Money of our Kingdom of Great-Britain, above all Out-goings and Reprifes: And that they and their Successors, by the same Name, shall have full Power and Authority to give, grant, fell, leafe, demife and difpose of the same real Estate and Hereditaments whatsoever, for Life

or Lives, or Years, or for ever; and also all Goods, Chattels. and personal Estate whatsoever, at their Will and Pleasure, as they shall judge to be most beneficial and advantageous for the faid Library. And that it shall and may be lawful for them and their Successors, for ever hereafter, to have a common Seal to serve for the Causes and Business of them and their Succeffors; and the fame Seal to change, alter, break and make new from Time to Time, at their Will and Pleafure. And our Royal Will and Pleafure is, That when our faid Corporation hereby erected, shall have acquired by Subscriptions of the Members, by Donation or otherwise, a proper and convenient Piece of Ground in our faid City of New-York, and Funds sufficient for that Purpose, that they do erect within our faid City of New-York, a public Library; which we Will shall for ever hereafter be called by the Name of, THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY. And that it shall and may be lawful for our faid Corporation, from Time to Time and at all Times hereafter, to erect for their Use and Convenience any other House, Houses or Buildings whatever: And for the better carrying into Execution the Purposes aforesaid, our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and we do hereby for Us, our Heirs and Succeffors, give and grant unto the Trustees of, THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, and their Successors, for ever, That there shall be for ever hereafter belonging to our faid Corporation, twelve Truftees of the faid Library and Corporation, who shall conduct and manage the Affairs and Buliness of the faid Library and Corporation, in the Manner herein after directed and appointed. And we do hereby affign, constitute and appoint the aforefaid JOHN WATTS, WILLIAM SMITH, ROBERT R. LIVINGSTON, WHITEHEAD HICKS, WILLIAM LIVINGSTON, GOLDSBROW BANYAR, SAMUEL JONES, PETER VAN BRUGH LIVINGSTON, PETER KETELTAS, WALTER RUTHERFURD, DAVID CLARKSON, and SAMUEL BARD, to be the present Trustees of the faid Library and Corporation, and who shall hold, possess and enjoy, their faid Offices until the last Tuesday in April now next enfuing; and for keeping up the Succession in the faid Offices, our Royal Will and Pleafure is, and we do hereby for us, our Heirs and Successors, establish, direct and require of, and give and grant to the Truffees of, THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, and their Successors for ever, that on the faid last Tuesday in April next ensuing, and yearly and every Year for ever thereafter, on the last Tuesday in April in every Year, the Members for the Time being,

of cur faid Corporation, shall meet at the EXCHANGE in Broad-Street, in our faid City of New-York, or at some other convenient Place in our faid City of New-York, to be fixed and ascertained by some of the Bye-Laws or Regulations of our faid Corporation, and there by the Majority of fuch of them as shall so meet, shall by Ballot elect and choose twelve of their Members to be Trustees of the faid Library and Corporation for the Year enfuing, who shall immediately enter upon their faid Offices, and hold, exercise and enjoy the same, from the Time of such Elections for and during the Space of one Year, and until other fit Perfons shall be elected and chosen in their Places; and in Case any of the faid Persons by these Presents nominated and appointed to be Trustees of the said Library and Corporation, or who shall hereafter be elected and chosen thereto, shall die or remove out of our faid City of New-York before the Time of their appointed Service shall be expired, or refuse or neglect to act in and execute the faid Office, then and in every fuch Cafe, Our Royal Will and Pleafure is, and we do hereby give and grant, and direct and require, That the furviving Trustees for the Time being of our faid Corporation, shall by Majority of Voices nominate and choose another or others of the Members of our faid Corporation, in the Place and Stead of him or them fo dying, removing, refusing or neglecting to act, within thirty Days after fuch Contingency; · hereby giving and granting, that fuch Person and Persons as shall be so chosen and appointed from Time to Time, by the Majority of the furviving Trustees for the Time being of our faid Corporation, shall have, hold, exercise and enjoy their faid Offices from the Time of fuch Election and Appointment, until the last Tuesday in April then next ensuing, and until other or others be legally chosen in his or their Place or Stead, as fully and amply as the Person or Persons in whose Place he or they shall be chosen could or might have done by Virtue of these Presents; and we do hereby will and direct, that this Method shall for ever hereafter be used for filling up all Vacancies in the faid Office of Trustees between the annual Elections above directed : And further our Royal Will and Pleafure is, and we do hereby for us, our Heirs and Succeffors, ordain and appoint, and give and grant to the Truftees of THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, and their Successors, that any one of the Trustees for the Time being, shall and may from Time to Time, as Occasion may require, fummon and call together at fuch Times and Places in our faid City of New-York, as they shall respectively think proper,

the Trustees of the faid Library and Corporation for the Time being, giving them at least one Day's Notice thereof : And we do hereby require them to meet accordingly; and give, grant and ordain, That any Seven or more of the faid Trustees, being so convened together, shall for ever hereafter be a legal Meeting of the faid Corporation; and they, or the major Part of them fo met, shall have full Power and Authority to adjourn from Day to Day, or for any other Time, as the Bufiness of our said Corporation may require, and to do, execute, transact, manage and perform in the Name of our faid Corporation, all and every Act and Acts, Thing and Things whatfover, which our faid Corporation are or shall by Virtue of these our Letters Patent, be authorized to do, act, transact, manage and perform, in as full and ample Manner, as if all and every the Trustees of our faid Corporation were present and consenting thereto: And further, we do hereby for us, our Heirs and Successors, ordain and appoint, and give and grant to the Trustees of THE NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, that at any and every fuch legal Meeting of any Seven or more of the Trustees for the Time being, of our faid Corporation, it shall and may be lawful for them in Writing, under the Seal of our faid Corporation, to make, frame, constitute, establish and ordain, from Time to Time, and at all Times hereafter, fuch Laws, Constitutions, Ordinances, Regulations and Statutes, for the better Government of the Officers, Members and Servants. of the faid Corporation; for regulating the Terms upon which the Books of the faid Library shall be lent out, both to Members and others; for fixing and afcertaining the Places of Meeting of our faid Corporation, for the Election of Truftees, and the Places of Meeting of the Trustees; for regulating the Management and Disposition of the Books of the faid Library and the Monies, Funds and Effects, belonging to the faid Corporation; the transferring Rights in the faid Library from one Person to another; and all other the Business and Affairs whatfoever, of our faid Corporation, as they or the major Part of them fo legally met shall judge best for the general Good of the faid Corporation, and for the more effectual promoting, increasing and preserving the said Library; and the same, or any of them, to alter, amend or repeal from Time to Time, as they or the major Part of them so met as aforefaid, shall think proper: Provided such Laws, Constitutions, Regulations, Ordinances and Statutes, be not repugnant to the Laws of that Part of our Kingdom of Great-Britain called England, nor of our Province of New-York.

And also at any and every such legal Meeting of any Seven or more of the faid Truftees for the Time being, of our faid Corporation, it shall and may be lawful for them, or the Majority of them so met as aforesaid, to nominate and appoint one of the Members of the faid Corporation to be. Treasurer, and one other of the Members of the said Corporation to be Secretary of the faid Corporation, and fome other fit Person or Persons to be Keeper or Keepers of the faid Library, and from Time to Time, to appoint them the faid Treasurer, Secretary and Librarian, and each of them, their respective Powers, Authorities, Business, Trusts and Attendances, and to displace and discharge them, or any of them, and to appoint other or others in their Places and Stead. And further, it is our Royal Will and Pleafure, and we do hereby for us, our Heirs and Successors, will and ordain, and give and grant, to the Trustees of the New-York Society Library, and their Successors for ever, that it shall and may be lawful, to and for each and every of the Members, for the Time being, of our faid Corporation, his and their Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to give, fell, alien, affign, devife or dispose of their respective Rights in the faid Library, and that their respective Assigns shall be Members of our faid Corporation, and be intitled to all and every the fame Rights and Privileges in the faid Library, and in our faid Corporation, as the Members hereby made, are intitled to, by Virtue of these Presents. Provided always, That a Part of a Right in the faid Library, shall not intitle the Proprietor or Owner thereof, to any Privilege whatfoever in the faid Library or Corporation: And also that all and every the original Subscribers to the faid Library, or their Affigns respectively, upon paying to the Treasurer for the Time being, of the faid Corporation, for the Use of the said Library, the full Arrears of the yearly Sum of Ten Shillings, agreed by the faid original Subscription to be paid yearly; that then and from thenceforth, each of the Perfons fo paying the faid Arrears, shall thereupon become Members of the faid Corporation, and be intitled to all and every the fame Rights and Privileges in the faid Library and Corporation, as the Members herein particularly named are intitled to by Virtue of these Presents : And further, That at any and every such legal Meeting of any Seven or more of the Trustees for the Time being, of the faid Library, it shall and may be lawful for them, or the major Part of them, fo met as aforefaid, to clect and choose by the Majority of their Voices, and in such Manner and Form, and upon fuch Terms and Conditions as fhall

shall be directed, ordained and established for that Purpose, by any the faid Bye-Laws, Statutes, Constitutions, or Ordinances, of the faid Corporation; and admit under the Common-Seal of our faid Corporation, fuch and fo many Perfons to be Members of our faid Corporation, as they shall think beneficial to the faid Library; which Members fo admitted, shall be intitled to, and have, hold and enjoy, all and every and the same Rights and Privileges, as the Members herein particularly named are intitled to by Virtue of these Presents. And likewise, we do will, ordain, direct and require, that each and every of the Members for the Time being, of our faid Corporation, shall on the first Tuesday in May next, and yearly on the first Tuesday in May in every Year for ever hereafter, pay to the Treasurer for the Time being, of the said Corporation, the Sum of Ten Shillings current Money of New-York, for the Use of the said Library; and in Case any of the faid yearly Sums of Ten Shillings, shall at any Time or Times hereafter, be in Arrear and unpaid by the Space of thirty Days next after any of the Days on which the same ought to be paid, that then the Person or Persons from whom the same shall be due and payable, shall thereupon forfeit and be utterly excluded from all his or their Rights and Privileges in and to the faid Library and Corporation, but shall at any Time within five Years thereafter, upon Payment of all the Arrears due to the Time of Payment, be reftored to his and their respective Rights and Privileges in the faid Library and Corporation, as if no fuch Forfeiture had happened: And Laftly, we do by these Prefents for us, our Heirs and Successors, give and grant to the Trustees of the New-York SOCIETY LIBRARY, and their Successors, for ever, That this our present Charter shall be deemed, adjudged, and construed in all Cases, most favourably and for the best Benefit and Advantage of our faid Corporation; and that this our present Grant being entered on Record, as is herein after expressed, shall be for ever hereafter good and effectual in the Law, according to our Royal Intent and Meaning herein before declared, and without any other Licence, Grant or Confirmation from us, our Heirs or Successors hereafter, by the faid Corporation to be had or obtained, notwithstanding any mis-recitals, non-recitals, not-naming, or mif-naming of any the aforefaid Offices, Franchifes, Privileges, Immunities, or other the Premifes, or any of them, and although no Writ of ad quod Damnum, or other Writs, Inquisitions or Precepts, hath been upon this Occasion had, made, issued or prosecuted, any Statute, Act, Ordinance

Ordinance or Provision; or other Matter or Thing to the contrary thereof in any wife notwithstanding. In TESTI-MONY whereof, we have caused these our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of our faid Province to be hereunto affixed, and the same to be entered on Record in our Secretary's Office, for our faid Province of New-York, in one of the Books of Patents there remaining. WITNESS our trufty and well-beloved WILLIAM TRYON, Efg; our Captain General and Governor in Chief, in and over our faid Province of New-York, and the Territories depending thereon in America, Chancellor and Vice-Admiral of the fame, at our Fort in our City of New-York, by and with the Advice and Consent of our Council for our faid Province of New-York, the ninth Day of November, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-two, and of our Reign the Thirteenth.

LAWS, ORDINANCES, AND REGULATIONS.

Made and established by the TRUSTEES of the NEW-YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY, in Pursuance and by Virtue of the CHARTER granted to them by His Majesty GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. under the Great Seal of the Province of New-York, bearing Date the Ninth Day of November, in the Thirteenth Year of his Reign, and in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Two, at a legal Meeting of the said Trustees at the Tavern kept by Sarah Brock, in the City of New-York, on the Seventh Day of January, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Three.

Seven of the Trustees named in the faid Charter.

I. BE IT ORDAINED by the faid Trustees, and it is bereby Ordained by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful, for every Member of the faid Corporation, to take and have out of the faid Library, one Book and no more at one Time. And that a Folio Volume may be kept and detained, fix Weeks; a Quarto, four Weeks; an Octavo, three Weeks; and a Duodecimo, two Weeks: And if any Person shall keep a Book out of the said Library for a longer Time, fuch Person shall forfeit and pay to the Keeper or Keepers of the faid Library for the Time being, for the Use of the said Library, for a Folio, four Pence; for a Quarto, three Pence; for an Octavo, towo Pence; and for a Duodecimo, one Penny, for every Day fuch Book shall be kept out of the said Library, above the Time limitted as aforefaid; and fuch Person so keeping any Book out of the faid Library, above the Time allowed, as aforefaid, shall not be intitled to take or have any other Book out of the faid Library, until the faid Forfeitures be paid. II. AND

II. AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That every Person who shall loose or damage any Book belonging to the said Library, shall make good the same to the said Library, before he or she have any other Book out of the said Library.

III. AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That the Keeper or Keepers of the faid Library, shall open the faid Library and attend the fame, from twelve until two o'Clock on every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, Holy Days excepted, and shall keep an exact Account of the Books taken out, and of the Time when, and by whom, and when returned, and shall account for and pay to the Treasurer of the said Library for the Time being, when ever thereunto required by him, all Fines and Forseitures received for detaining Books above the limitted Time, or for damaging them.

IV. AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Perfon shall at any Time hereafter, claim a Right in the said Library by Purchase or Gift from any Member of the said Corporation, or from the Executors or Administrators of any Member, such Person so claiming such Right, shall not be intitled to have or take any Book out of the said Library, nor to vote for Trustees, until he or she shall have proved his or her Title before the Trustees of the said Library for the Time being, at one of their legal Meetings, and an Entry be made thereof in their Minutes, in Order that it may be known who are the Members of the said Corporation.

V. AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That there shall always be kept in the Library Room, a Liif of the Names of all Persons intitled to have or take Books out of the Library, and that the Keeper or Keepers of the said Library, do not at any Time deliver any Bookout of the said Library, to or for, or on Account of, any Person whose Name shall not be contained in the said List.

VI. AND IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforesaid, That the Treasurer of the said Library for the Time being, shall on the first Tuesday of April, in every Year, lay his Accounts before the Trustees of the said Library, for their Inspection.

VII. AND BE IT FURTER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That every Perfon who shall be delirous of being a Member of the said Corporation, shall be admitted upon Payment of Five Pounds, to the Treasurer for the Time being, for the Use of the said Library, provided he subscribes before the sirst Day of May, 1774.

VIII. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Authority aforefaid, That the Common Seal of this Corporation, be kept by the Secretary for the Time being, and that every Admission of any Person as a Member of this Corporation, be sealed with the said Seal and signed by the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary for the Time being, and that the Secretary put the said Seal to all Admissions, signed by the Treasurer for the Time being, without any other Warrant; but that he do not put the said Seal to any other Writing whatsoever, until the same shall have been signed by at lenst Seven of the Trussees for the Time being, and the said Seal ordered to be put thereto, at some legal Meeting of the Trussees.
