LOANING OF BOOKS.

Folios may be kept 6 weeks, quartos 3 weeks, octavos 2 weeks, duodecimos 1 week. Members residing more than 10 miles from the Library are allowed 1 week longer. A Book may be again taken out, unless another member has applied for it.

FINES .- One cent per volume must be paid for each day they are detained over the time allowed. Loss or damage of books must be paid for; if a part of a set, the value of the entire set must be paid.

No member can lend any book belonging to the Library.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

TRUSTEES

OF THE

NEW YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1867.

THE Trustees of the New York Society Library, in obedience to a standing rule of their Corporation making it the duty of the Trustees to lay before the members of the Society, at their annual meeting in each year, a Report on the affairs and state of the Institution, do submit the following Report:

In their last Annual Report, the Trustees then in office stated at large the grounds and reasons upon which they had felt it to be necessary, for the interests of the Institution confided to their care, to apply to the State Legislature for such an amendment to their charter as might allow an increase of the several annual payments of Shareholders, to a rate proportioned to the general increase of prices, which affects everything required for the support of the Library and Reading-Rooms, including the necessary augmentation of compensation to every person employed by the Trustees. That Report also stated in full the opposition of a portion of the Shareholders to the proposed amendment of the Charter, and the course of legislation in relation to the measure.

At the date of that Report (April 1, 1866), the bill introduced on the petition of the Trustees, after some discussion and amendment, had passed both the Senate and Assembly of the State, and was then before the Governor, awaiting his action thereon. The Report then added that if the bill should be approved by the Governor and become a law, "it would be in the discretion of any Board of Trustees which might be in office when the Act had taken effect, to augment the annual dues and carry out the provisions of the law;" its language being permissive, merely, and not directory.

The Act, however, became a law by the Governor's approval, before the time of the Annual Meeting of the Stockholders, which took place on the evening of the 24th of April, 1866.

The Board of Trustees in office at the time when the Act took effect, and who had petitioned for the measure, took no action thereon, but submitted the law, with their Annual Report, to the General Meeting of the members of this Corporation.

At that meeting, after the reading of the Report and of the Act amending the Charter, and discussion thereon, the members

Resolved, That the Act of the Legislature, passed at its recent session, to increase the annual payments on the shares of the New York Society Library, and to authorize the Trustees of said Society to commute their annual dues, be accepted; and that the said Trustees be authorized, in their discretion, to exercise all the powers therein conferred upon them.

At the Annual Election held that evening, according to the Charter, the former Board of Trustees was re-elected, to serve for the ensuing year.

In order to carry out the instructions of the General Meeting of Corporators, a Special Meeting of the Trustees was held on the 30th April, 1866—all the members except one being present—when, after reading of the late Act, and the minutes of the last meeting of the Corporators, and deliberation thereupon, it was *unanimously*

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the New York Society Library is hereby directed to demand and receive from the members of said Society, on the first Tuesday of every May hereafter, the sum of four dollars upon each and every right or share in said Library; and in addition to any sum said Treasurer was heretofore authorized to demand and receive, that is to say, upon shares which have heretofore been assessed two dollars, six dollars; on those heretofore assessed six dollars, ten dollars; and those heretofore free, four dollars.

It was also unanimously

Resolved (The By-Laws having been suspended by an unanimous vote to admit such amendment without delay), that Section IV of Chapter IV of the By-Laws is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"The sum for the commutation of the annual dues shall be one

hundred and twenty-five dollars for the annual payment of ten dollars; and seventy-five dollars for the annual payment of six dollars; and fifty dollars for the annual payment of four dollars, on the respective rights subject to such payments."

This meeting of the newly-elected Trustees was held with as little delay as might be, on the day preceding that upon which, by the Charter, the annual payments for the next year became due, for the purpose of carrying into immediate effect the instructions and resolution of the General Meeting of Corporators. The augmentations were cheerfully complied with by most of the Stockholders, so that the amount received for the year is \$9,420; the net income of the year preceding having been only \$5,043.61.

A few only of the Shareholders have hesitated or refused to pay the increased amount, it is trusted that after they have read and weighed the causes and necessity of the augmentation, set forth in the Report for 1865–1866, and the resolutions of the General Meeting of Corporators given in the present Report, they will see reason to withdraw all objection.

The total expenditures, for all purposes, for the support of the Library and Reading-Room during the year, were \$7,949.99. The number of volumes added by purchase was 1,060, of which the greater part were purchased in this country; but a portion were imported. A large additional order has been sent to Europe, which, it is hoped, will be received in a short time. It contains many publications of science and general literature, which have often been inquired after by Shareholders and their families. Besides the number of volumes purchased (1,060), an additional number of 301 was added of volumes of periodicals, etc., bought and imported for the Reading-Room, and transferred to the Library after their novelty had ceased to attract. Donations of 165 volumes were also made, making the whole number of volumes added during the year, 1,526, and increasing the aggregate number of the volumes in the Library to about 53,000.

These donations do not include above an hundred pamphlets, all of them worthy of preservation, and some of great curiosity and value. The collection of public documents, bound files of newspapers and pamphlets, in possession of the Institution, continues to be much consulted, and is of great public utility.

The number of volumes taken out for circulation in the families of Shareholders has suffered no abatement.
