Regulations.

LOANING OF BOOKS.

Members not indebted for annual payments, fines, etc., may take out one work, if it consists of not more than one folio, or one quarto, or three octavo, or six duodecimo volumes.

Folios may be kept 6 weeks, quartos 3 weeks, octavos 2 weeks, duodeeimos 1 week. Members residing more than 10 miles from the Library are allowed 1 week longer. A Book may be again taken out, unless another member has applied for it.

Fines.—One cent per volume must be paid for each day they are detained over the time allowed. Loss or damage of books must be paid for; if a part of a set, the value of the entire set must be paid.

No member can lend any book belonging to the Library.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

TRUSTEES

OF THE

NEW YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1870.

THE Trustees of the New York Society Library present to its members their accustomed Yearly Report of the affairs and state of this Institution, brought down to the 31st of March, 1870.

Before presenting the statistics connected with this subject, it may not be out of place to make some observations in regard to the general influence of a Library, like that of this Institution. We have the learning and thought of all ages and countries, in reference to all subjects of human investigation, represented here; but of limited extent when compared with libraries on a broader basis and with a corresponding patronage. of Egypt, the dim legendary literature of the East, the classical treasures of Greece and Rome, the wealth of Christian antiquity, the abstruse systems of the schoolmen, the multitudinous literature of modern timesthe harvest-period in the world's history of all the past generations of seedsowing—all these are, to some degree at least, spread before us in this Institution. And more than all, perhaps so far as the sum of influence is concerned, is the Reading-Room, with the periodical literature of the day. This marvellous age of ours has made us citizens of all countries, and the whole world our home; and amid the pamphlets and papers which each day brings within these walls, we have a more intimate acquaintance with London and Paris and Rome, to say nothing of India and

China and Japan, than we had a generation ago of Philadelphia and Boston.

Here then are the materials for the influence we are considering. An important element in that consideration is the class of persons upon whom this influence is primarily exercised. This is not a Library to which the laboring classes readily have access. Its locality, its constitution, and its associations have tended to confine it to the wealthier portion of society. This has been the result rather of circumstances than of any deliberate intention. This Institution partakes more of a private and social character than those great Public Institutions whose object it is to throw open the treasures of literature and science to every class in the community.

This being the case, it is an interesting inquiry to what extent the community is beneficially influenced by such a library as this.

In attempting to answer this inquiry we would lay down the proposition that the diffusion of information in one class in the community is a benefit to all classes.

The principle laid down and advocated with so much ingenuity and power by the late Mr. Buckle, that the progress of society is in proportion to the accumulation of knowledge, is true, so far as it goes. It would have been a complete truth, if he had conditioned the statement upon the constant presence and influence of moral sentiments. The reason of the truth, in this respect, of Mr. Buckle's proposition is, that the progress of society is advanced mainly by an improvement in the relations of various classes in society, and this improvement is effected as the result of a better understanding of these relations. The better understanding of these relations by any one class is a great step taken towards their improvement. Just so fast as they are well understood by all classes the improvement is accomplished. The tendency to settle national disputes without an appeal to arms, is the result of a better understanding of international relations, and some glimmering, at least, of the idea that what is for the true interest of one nation is for the interest of all. Slavery has ceased, because master and slave alike have come to understand that it is not the best form of relation which can subsist between them. difficulties existing between capital and labor will gradually yield to the increasing light which is thrown upon their relations by the investigations of political economy.

Now, in regard to most of these questions, there has been a remarkable ignorance, even among the better informed classes in society, until of late years. There begins to be now a more intelligent comprehension of them. And one of the principal causes of this is believed to be the establishment of these Circulating Libraries.

It is easy to see how they contribute to the promotion of wider intelli-

gence and larger views on these questions. If a man confines his reading to the books which he has in his private library, or the papers which he happens to take, the result will probably be, to confirm him in views which he has already adopted, or prejudices which he has already imbibed. He buys his books and subscribes for his papers, for the very reason that they coincide with the opinions which he has already formed. But, if accustomed to resort to this Library and Reading-Room, he finds himself at once under influences which lead him to look upon all sides of a question. Every possible aspect of it is presented. The arguments which are urged from all quarters press themselves upon him, and he is likely to become possessed of larger information and sounder opinions, and at the same time to look more charitably upon the errors and prejudices of others.

Let a large class of those who are from position or circumstances among the most influential members of society, be brought constantly under the pressure of the manifold teachings of which such a Library is the source; let them see daily in this array of periodicals the result of discussion in reference to great questions which now interest the world; and the result must be an improved sentiment and a higher tone in the community at large. It will be seen that the antagonisms of different classes in society are a relic of barbarism. The induction of facts will have shown more and more clearly the common interests of all. These speculative principles will embody themselves in practical results, and an important step be taken towards the harmonious adjustment of social relations.

This reconciliation of antagonisms is the great consummation to which all social progress is tending. After the innumerable struggles and conflicts of ages, there is at last to be peace and good-will. History is prophetic of the time when there shall be "purer manners, purer laws;" when there shall be freedom without license, and authority without despotism. Society is yet in a transition-state. The methods by which Providence is promoting this progress are many and diverse, and they are adapted both to the heart and the intellect.

The institutions of Christianity are educating the heart of the race; and literature and science are performing a like office for the mind. Among the agencies which help to diffuse the treasures of the latter, and hasten the coming of a more auspicious age, let us exert our united efforts and individual endeavor to make the public, and especially the supporters and friends of this Society Library, feel more satisfied with its genial and salutary influences, and with its indispensable importance to the various classes that require just such an institution in this the Metropolitan City of our land.

We turn now to another subject that has called forth an expression of the deep regrets in which the Trustees in common with their fellow-citizens have recently participated, occasioned by the death of Gulian C. Verplanck. Immediately on the occurrence of this sad event, at a meeting held expressly for the purpose, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted; and they are here inserted as bearing testimony to the views entertained by every member of the Board of the remarkable character, eminent attainments, and useful life of this lamented gentleman.

At a meeting of the Trustees of the New York Society Library, held at the Library on Saturday the 19th of March, 1870, the following preamble and resolution were offered by the Hon. J. Romeyn Brodhead, and unan-

imously adopted:

"The Trustees of the New York Society Library, having learned that their venerable Chairman, Gulian Crommeline Verplanck, died yesterday at his residence in this city, desire to unite with other institutions with which the distinguished deceased was connected, in expressing their most respectful appreciation of the eminent literary ability of their late colleague, of his high tone of character, of his true courtesy as a gentleman and a friend; and of the many valuable services which he has rendered to the public in various legislative and official positions.

"The Trustees, therefore, resolve that they will, as a body, attend the funeral of their deceased colleague and chairman, and they direct their Secretary to transmit a copy of this minute to the family of Mr. Verplanck,

with the expression of their affectionate condolence.

The press, as the best exponent of the general sentiments of our community, has spoken with much feeling and in an appreciative sense, of the rare excellence of our late chairman. At the previous monthly meeting of the Trustees he presided at the Board, and gave attention to the matters under discussion with his accustomed ability and practical good sense. This is but one of the numerous evidences of the existing activity of his mind and accuracy of his memory. In the former were stored vast treasures of diversified learning, the lore of antiquity, and the sources and character of the progress of modern times in science, literature, and art. He had made theological studies a specialty, and biblical criticism was an arena in which his accomplishments gave him a marked prominence. It was in these diversified fields of thought, and its clear and logical enunciation, that his memory was as a well-stored quiver, with an intellectual arrow ever ready, pointed, and skillfully directed at the mark.

Other societies and institutions, religious, charitable, literary, and social, have united in similar tokens and estimates of his great worth and useful services. His name and merits were widely known and highly appreciated. Deeply is this loss felt in the community, which he represented on the floor of Congress, of the Legislature of this, his native State, and in the departments and other situations in which he held official prominence and gained merited distinction. He was a public man, and attained to "the popularity that follows—not that which is run after."

All these honors and distinctions were evidences of an upright life and unblemished reputation. The approval of the wise and virtuous; the regards of his fellow-townsmen; the hearty thanks of hundreds of thousands of strangers seeking our shores; the gratitude of successive generations of children in our Public Schools; and the blessing of the poor, "always" with us, followed and rested upon him. Next to the sentence from on high, "Well done, good and faithful servant," the sentiments of our community, thus embodied, raise to the memory of Gulian Crommeline Verplanck a monument on earth far more enduring than granite itself.

Fourscore years has the eloquent Psalmist assigned as the limit of man's existence, when his strength is but "labor and sorrow." Our venerable associate had not only attained to this limit, but at the age of 83 years and upwards, until within a short period before his death, resembled the setting sun, whose rays are softly resplendent with light, until the lengthened shadows suddenly disappear. The recent tottering step showed that the casket which contained the jewel was fast decaying; but the eye, the memory, and the mind preserved their power, until the outer man yielded to the inevitable blow, and he died as he had lived, a Christian in faith and practice.

It was at first deemed but a fitting tribute to so much worth to embody in this report a memoir of his life. But the Chairman whom you have honored by placing him in the seat which he recently occupied, found the materials already gathered so voluminous as to be incapable of condensation in this annual report. Such a memoir must unavoidably assume a separate and a wider form, in order to do justice to Mr. Verplanck and harmonize with his life's work.

How strange the contrast appears of a single human life with the existence of a powerful nation, in contemporary duration! Yet the comparison is fairly made in the case before us, of a citizen of this republic with the republic itself. Mr. Verplanck was born on the 6th of August, 1786, and the national existence dates from April, 1783, only three years earlier. The Declaration of American Independence in 1776 was confirmed by the peace in 1783, and his birth is barely beyond the first decade.

What marvellous events occurred between these significantly described periods! The boldly defined and pregnant truths which that Declaration promulgated were ratified by the peace which followed, and by the implied faith of the nation. They only reached their culmination in March last, the month in which our associate died: But he lived to see the pledge redeemed, and the nation itself, with its renewed proclamation of untrammelled freedom, start afresh on its glorious mission, to bless and protect the dwellers among its people from all lands.

The history of this wondrous era is yet to be written. Its thronged

events, in crowding ranks and serried order, pass in review before the mind as it contemplates their grandeur and the influence of the result.

A faithful portraiture of these events is not to be drawn exclusively from the actors in the scenes of this grand national drama. In the development of its incidents, a right understanding of this momentous combination is associated with its complete success. The historian suitably adapted to the task will necessarily look to additional sources for materials for this work.

It is not on the battle-fields only where final consequences are wrought out by the priceless flow of precious blood, with the accompanying waste of untold wealth; nor is it in the cabinets of Government, or in Congressional halls and legislative bodies that facts and unprejudiced views are conclusively gathered. It requires also the clear judgment, and distinct reminiscences of sagacious practical public men; also of professional men, in all the diversified pursuits of active life; and lastly, of the learned, and the truly philosophical, familiar with the grounds and principles of such a history.

Men like Mr. Verplanck, learned and wise, benevolent and just, fearing God, and seeking the good of others, are types of that class of witnesses whose testimony, accurately presented, is beyond all impeachment and worthy of all acceptation.

In concluding these brief allusions to our deceased chairman, often as we enter into the Library, in our mind's eye we see him with book in hand, as he sat there from day to day, the personification of dignity blended with benevolence. His well-formed head and snowy locks gave a marked character to his fine and pleasing face, which never failed to impress strangers and friends most favorably, with its varying expression, as the subject started interested or aroused him. He had been, with few exceptions, a trustee of this Society for sixty years; and there are none that will feel his loss more than the members of this board, who knew his worth and tenderly cherish his memory.

In reference to the affairs and condition of this Library, the result of an inevitable incident, its income is becoming more and more affected by the upward movement of the population of the city. The vigorous efforts of its friends should therefore be enlisted, in order not only to sustain its long-established character, but to augment its resources by the sale of new rights or by other suitable and efficient measures. Such an increase of its means is especially needed at this time, to enable the Trustees to publish a new Catalogue, and to effect needed improvements in the Library building.

Several new periodicals have been added to the number taken for the Reading-Room, and a larger number of more expensive works have been purchased for the Library than in preceding years. The number of volumes added during the year now ending is—
