ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
OF THE  
NEW YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY.

IN compliance with the By-Laws of this Institution, the Trustees submit for the information of the Shareholders the following statement of the condition of its affairs at the close of the fiscal year, which terminated on the 31st day of March last past.

The Treasurer's Report is made up to the 1st day of April instant, and exhibits the condition of the Corporation, and the total amount of the money collected during the past year, as also the sources of the payments from time to time received by him, and the disposition made of the aggregate amount, with the specification of the balance now on hand.

The Committee appointed to audit the Treasurer's accounts have made a report of the results of their examination, which is hereto annexed, and furnishes an accurate statement of the general condition of the corporation.

Under the supervision of a Special Committee of this Board, repairs and alterations have been made, which, for a long time have been much needed, and the spacious rooms of the Library are now tastefully decorated and exceedingly attractive. Of the amount expended in repairs and alterations, but a small proportion has been devoted to ornamentation, and it is confidently believed that when it is considered how very little, comparatively, has been expended for such repairs since the erection of the building in 1856—a period of twenty-two years—the expenditure now made will not be deemed extravagant, but on the contrary, not only judicious, but also highly beneficial to the interests of the Library.

To carry out these repairs and improvements, a member of the Board of Trustees has kindly advanced the necessary funds, the same to be repaid to him as soon as the income of the Library will permit.

The Executor of the late George J. Foster is now ready to pay over to the Trustees the sum of three thousand dollars, the amount of a legacy from Mr. Foster to the New York Society Library. This bequest is to be added to the other invested funds, and the income expended in the purchase of books.

Owing to the fact that the interest on the generous gifts which were duly acknowledged in the last annual report, has been received only within a few days previous to the date of this Report, the additions to the books of the Library to be made from this source cannot appear in the list hereto appended.

At his own individual expense, a member of the Board of Trustees is generously fitting up an alcove, to be designated "The John C. Green Alcove," and designed for the reception of such books relating to the Fine Arts as may be purchased with one-half the income of the "Green Fund."

The Trustees feel themselves authorized to congratulate the Shareholders on the general state of the trust committed to their charge, and the great improvement of the establishment during the past year; They entertain the hope that the present condition and prospects of the Library will encourage and stimulate its friends to renewed efforts in its behalf, more especially to increase the amount of its invested funds for the purchase of books.

That they have examined the accounts of the Treasurer for the year ending March 31, 1878, compared the expenditures with the vouchers, and find the same to be correct.

The balance remaining in the hands of the Treasurer to the credit of the Corporation on the first day of April, 1878, is \$1,319.78.

Folios may be kept 6 weeks, quartos 3 weeks, octavos 2 weeks, duodecimos 1 week. Members residing more than 10 miles from the Library are allowed 1 week longer. A Book may be again taken out, unless another member has applied for it.

FINES.—*One cent per volume* must be paid for each day they are detained over the time allowed. Loss or damage of books must be paid for; if a part of a set, the value of the entire set must be paid.
