## REGULATIONS.

Lending.-Every shareholder of or subscriber to the New York Society Library shall be allowed to take out four works at a time, of which not more than one shall be a new work.

New books may be kept one week only. Other books may be kept three weeks, with the privilege of renewal, unless other members have applied for them.

Books recently purchased or for any reason in demand will be considered as new books.

Fines.-One cent per volume must be paid for each day they are retained over the time allowed. Loss or damage of books must be paid for; if a part of a set, the value of the entire set must be paid for.

No member shall lend any books belonging to the library,
The annual dues of shareholders should be paid by cheque to the order of the Treasurer.

Temporary subscribers are required, at the time of subscription, to sign the customary agreement in the "Subscribers' Book." The Librarian will give a receipt for each subscription.

Payments should be made to the Librarian for fines, books lost, expressage, postage, etc., and receipts will be furnished by him in the name of the Treasurer at the time of payment.

## ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## Trustees of the New York Society Library.

The Trustees of the New York Society Library respectfully submit to the members the following statement for the year ending March 3Ist, 1908:

The report of the Treasurer, presented herewith, shows that the receipts from all sources have amounted to $\$ 18,124.93$ and the disbursements of all kinds to $\$ 17,705 \cdot 56$. Of the receipts $\$ 945.94$ should be credited to capital and $\$ 2,124.5 \mathrm{I}$ to the income of the Green Fund.

Our messengers carried 37,537 volumes during the year, visiting in,288 residences and offices between No. I Broadway and 147th Street.

The income derived by the Library from temporary subscriptions by persons other than members is steadily increasing, having risen from the sum of two hundred and one dollars in the year 1900 to more than two thousand dollars during the current year.

In the last year's report it was mentioned that at the request of the Union League and Metropolitan Clubs our Library was supplying them with current literature. The list of the leading Clubs of the City to which reading matter is now furnished includes the Army and Navy, the Century, the Columbia University, the Knickerbocker, the Metropolitan, the Yale, the Union, the Union League and the University.

The question of the supply of adequate space for the accommodation of the Library's books is a matter of serious concern to the Trustees. As a remedy for the overcrowding of our shelves new bookstacks have been placed in the old reading room on the first floor of our building and the necessary electric lighting has been installed. The relief afforded by this action is, however, only temporary.

A solid mahogany counter, with bookshelves at each end, has been placed at the east side of the main room, which has added to the attractive appearance of the room and to the convenience of the staff.

A history of the Library, prepared by Austin Baxter Keep, A.M., of Columbia University, is now in the De Vinne Press. A large part of the expense of the preparation of this volume has been borne by the Trustees. It will, it is believed, be a complete and accurate history of our Library, one of the few institutions now existing under charter from the Crown of Great Britain, and will be appropriately illustrated.

Many valuable gifts have been received during the year:
From President Roosevelt, ten volumes of "The Lives of the Lord Chancellors"; from J. Pierpont Morgan, Esq., "Catalogue of His Collection of Miniatures," in three volumes, privately printed, of which our copy is No. 22; from Mrs. Cadwalader Jones, "Gérôme's Works," in nine volumes; from Henry C. Swords, Esq., "Trade and Trade Centres of History," privately printed; from F. Augustus Schermerhorn, Esq., one hundred and sixteen volumes and pamphlets, and numerous volumes from Dr. Frederick S. Halsey, Mr. H. D. Spears, Mr. J. M. Betton, Miss Helen Van Cortlandt de Peyster, Miss Drisler, and others.

Among the more expensive books purchased for the Green Alcove, were: "Handzeichnungen der Höllandischen und Vlämischen schule im Königlichen kupferstichkabinet zu Amsterdam," in two folio volumes; "British Portrait Painters and Engravers of the 18th Century"; Architecture of the Renaissance in England and Later Renaissance Architecture in England"; four folio volumes; "Les Grands Chateaux de France," two volumes ; "Corot and his Work," two volumes.

With great sorrow, the Trustees record the loss during the year of three of their number, Frederick Sheldon, George Van Nest Baldwin, and Stiles Franklin Stanton.

Mr. Sheldon received much of his youthful education in France and was graduated from Harvard in 1842. A thorough acquaintance with Continental and English literature, which was continued during his long life, resulted in unusual literary culture and fine discrimination. He was elected a Trustee in 1871 ; was Chair-
man of the Board, 1892-94, and was a member of the Finance Committee, 1882-1885, 1898-1907, and a member of the Library Committee, 1893-1907.

His knowledge of history and biography was remarkable and his conversation uncommonly interesting. Several of his essays were gathered and printed by him a few years ago and presented to the Library. For delicacy of expression and quaint humor they are unsurpassed. He was the type of gentleman pictured by Sir Philip Sidney, "High thoughts seated in the heart of courtesy."

Mr. Baldwin was elected a member of the Board of Trustees in 1883; was Secretary, 1883-1894; was Chairman, 1894-1898, and was a member of the Library Committee from 1883, serving as its Chairman from 1898 till his death. Outside of his profession, the Library was one of the chief interests of his life. He seldom failed to attend the meetings of the Trustees and of the Members during the twenty-five years of his trusteeship. During his annual trips abroad much of his time was spent in the bookshops of Paris and London in an ever-successful search for rare and valuable books which, year by year, he added to our Library's treasures. His long service to our institution in many capacities, his legal and literary knowledge and practical common sense, made him an invaluable member of the Board of Trustees and the loss is felt more deeply as the days go by.

Mr. Stanton became a Trustee in April, 1906, and was appointed on the House Committee in November, 1906. During the short time of his connection with the Library he manifested a deep interest in its affairs and endeared himself to all his associates.
