REGULATIONS.

Lending.—Every shareholder of or subscriber to the New York Society Library shall be allowed to take out *four* works at a time, of which not more than one shall be a new work.

New books may be kept one week only. Other books may be kept three weeks, with the privilege of renewal, unless other members have applied for them.

Books recently purchased or for any reason in demand will be considered as new books.

Fines.—One cent per volume must be paid for each day they are retained over the time allowed. Loss or damage of books must be paid for; if a part of a set, the value of the entire set must be paid for.

No member shall lend any books belonging to the library,

The annual dues of shareholders should be paid by cheque to the order of the Treasurer.

Temporary subscribers are required, at the time of subscription, to sign the customary agreement in the "Subscribers' Book." The Librarian will give a receipt for each subscription.

Payments should be made to the Librarian for fines, books lost, expressage, postage, etc., and receipts will be furnished by him in the name of the Treasurer at the time of payment.

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

TRUSTEES OF THE NEW YORK SOCIETY LIBRARY.

The Trustees of the New York Society Library present to the members the following account of their doings as such trustees for the year ending March 31st, 1909.

From the report of the Treasurer hereto appended, it will appear that the receipts of income from all sources during the year (including \$2,390.61, income of the Green Fund), have amounted to \$18,427.88, while the expenses paid thereout have amounted to \$17,934.83. The mortgage of \$30,000 covering Number 38 West 46th Street, formerly held for the Green Fund, has been paid off and the proceeds, with \$1,100 from the Commutation Fund, and \$1,400 saved from income, have been invested in a first mortgage of Number 140 West 116th Street. The 46th Street mortgage was at four per cent. interest. The 116th Street mortgage pays five per cent.

Year by year the Library grows in usefulness and extends its work. The history of the year which has closed shows the record of an enlarging constituency which appreciates its privileges, and of a wider dissemination of the Library's books. The revenue from temporary subscriptions is steadily increasing. For the year under review the receipts from that source have exceeded by about \$500. those of the preceding year, and there has been an increase of over two thousand in the number of volumes delivered by our messengers. In response to letters and telephonic messages, thirteen thousand visits during the year have been paid by them to residences and offices from the Bowling Green to 151st Street in the distribution of our literature.

For several years effort has been made to obtain the portraits of the men who from time to time from the inception of our institution to the present day have served the Library upon its Board of Trustees. The endeavor has been so far successful as to warrant during the past few months the exhibition in the main room of our building of likenesses of these gentlemen. The exhibition covers the first century of the Library's existence. Likenesses of many of the Trustees, however, are still lacking. Members and friends of our corporation are, therefore, respectfully asked to contribute to the completeness of our collection. Gifts of such portraits in oil or water-colors, engravings or photographs, will be gladly accepted.

In December an exhibition was held in honor of the tercentenary of the birth of John Milton. The Library is the fortunate possessor of the first edition of "Paradise Lost," and of numerous other editions of the various works of this poet, and also of a small picture frame made from the wood of the house in which Milton began the dictation of his greatest poem. In honor of the occasion, Mrs. Catherine L. Olmsted presented the Library with the Pickering edition of Milton's complete works in eight volumes, beautifully bound in blue crushed levant.

In December, also, the long-expected history of the Library, prepared by Austin Baxter Keep, A.M., was issued from the DeVinne Press in an edition of five hundred copies. It is a clever and interesting work of over six hundred pages, very handsomely printed and illustrated—a credit to the author and the institution. The book is on sale by Messrs. Charles Scribner's Sons.

Numerous gifts of valuable books, many of them privately printed, have been made to us during the year.

Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan has presented to the Library his beautifully printed "Catalogue of Manuscripts and Early Printed Books," and the last of the four volumes of his "Collection of Miniatures," of which work the first three volumes were received and acknowledged by the Trustees last year.

We are indebted to the Honorable Gherardi Davis for his "Regimental Colors in the War of the Revolution," with its supplement, an important historical work issued in a limited edition of one hundred and twenty-five copies.

From Mr. Charles T Harbeck we have received his "Contribution to the Bibliography of the History of the United States Navy," privately printed; from Mr. Beverley Chew a number of engravings relating to the early history of the Library and a number of catalogues of the Grolier Club exhibitions; from Miss K. E. Turnbull the "Book of the Fair," an expensive work in ten volumes; from Mr. J. H. Caswell a large volume containing envelopes with imprints of caricatures of the Civil War period; from Mr. E. J. Brockett a record of the leases prior to 1830 of all the ferry lines connecting with New York City.

Other books of value have been added to our shelves, the gifts of Mr. G. H. Baker, Mrs. S. S. Cox, the Honorable Chauncey M. Depew, Mrs. J. C. Draper, Miss M. Drisler, Mr. H. E. Gregory, Mrs. G. A. Lung, Miss M. G. Philipse, the Honorable Thomas C. Platt, Mrs. Schuyler Van Rensselaer, Miss A. M. Vail, and of others whose presents are highly appreciated and whose names are noted in the list of donors annexed to this report.

The attention of the members is called to the accessions to the "John C. Green Alcove," of which a list is printed herewith.

The Governor has recently signed a bill introduced in the Assembly by the Honorable Beverley R. Robinson, at the instance of the Trustees, which provides that after the annual election this year the Trustees shall by lot divide themselves into three classes, of five members each, to serve respectively for one, two and three years, and that thereafter at every annual election five members shall be elected to the Board to take the place of the members whose terms shall then have expired. The Trustees feel that this change in the method of election will be of advantage to the Library.

In August, 1908, James William Beekman, a member of the Board of Trustees from 1886 to 1896 and from 1905 to 1908, departed this life. "He was a man of honor and unswerving principle, by inheritance and by instinct, ever listening to and obeying the voice of an unsullied and enlightened conscience. He was courteous, not only with the courtesy which speaks of culture and good breeding, but with the gentle kindliness which sprang from his warm and pure and generous heart. He was clever and of sound judgment, a man of dignity and presence, good without austerity, bright and humorous without indelicacy, witty without asperity, an always desired companion, a staunch and steadfast friend." Mindful of his efficiency and faithfulness and of happy relations sorrowfully severed by his death, the Trustees have caused to be spread upon their minutes a memorial of him, from which the words above quoted are an extract.

In conclusion it is a pleasure to report that every indication points to a future of growth and prosperity for the Library.
