## REGULATIONS.

1.-Every member who shall not be indebted to the Corporation for any annual payment, or for fines or forfeitures incurred by him or her, and whose name shall be entered in the Treasurer's Register, shall, for every right owned by him or her, be entitled to receive from the Librarian, during the hours appointed for the Library to be open, four works at a time, of which not more than one shall be a new work.

New books may be kept one week only. Other books may be kept three weeks, with the privilege of renewal, unless other members have applied for them.
2. -The ownership of a share shall not give the privileges of the Library to more than one person and to his or her household.

If the ownership is vested in an estate or corporation, the privileges shall be restricted to such person and to his or her immediate household as may be designated by the executors of the estate or by the corporation.
3.-No person, whether member or not, shall lend any book belonging to the corporation to any person out of his dwelling-house.
4.-Any member who shall detain a book longer than the times above limited, respectively, shall forfeit and pay for every day such book shall be detained beyond the time so limited, one cent.
5.- If any member lose or damage a book, he shall make good the same to the Library ; and if the book lost or injured be one of a set, he shall pay, to the Treasurer, for the use of the corporation, the value of the entire set, and may thereupon receive for himself the residue of the whole set.

- 6.-The Librarian may let out books to persons not being members of the corporation, upon such terms and conditions as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Library Committee. But, if a member and a person who is not a member, should apply for the same book at the same time, the member shall have the preference.
7.-A member, besides the books he may be entitled to as a member, may take as many as he pleases on the same terms as persons who are not members.


## ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## Trustees of the New York Society Library.

The Trustees of the New York Society Library present to the members this their report for the year ending March 3Ist, I9II.

The receipts and disbursements have been about equal. The Treasurer's report hereto appended and to which attention is invited, shows a small balance on the right side of the account. Our annual subscriptions have been growing for several years, the Treasurer's reports for the past two years indicating an augmentation of income of about $\$ 1,000$ from this source in each year, a very gratifying indication of increasing interest in the Library.

Since the Treasurer's last report five ladies and gentlemen have been elected to membership.

The Trustees have pleasure in calling attention to the fact, of which it is believed many of the members are unaware, that their Library, besides being rich in current and standard literature, is the owner of many works of great rarity and value. In books published in and relating to the Colony and City of New York the library's collection is particularly rich and complete. It possesses one of the eight known copies of the "Acts and Resolves of the General Assembly of the Colony of New York," printed by William Bradford in 1694, one of the earliest and now the most valuable book ever printed in the Colony of New York. It also owns the most complete copy known to exist of the New York Gazette, the first newspaper published in this Colony. Among other treasures it has the only copy of which the Trustees have any knowledge of "The Journal of the Votes and Proceedings of the General Assembly of the Colony of New York, began the IIth of December 1770 and ended by prorogation the fourth of March, I77I.

Printed by Hugh Gaine MDCCLXXI." About ten years ago the Chief of the Document Department of the New York Public Library in compiling a bibliography of the New York General Assembly searched the libraries of England and America for material and no copy of this Journal printed by Gaine was found. Neither Ford in his Bibliography of Hugh Gaine, nor Evans in his American Bibliography mention, having seen a copy. Mr. Gaine was a member of the Board of Trustees from 1788 to 1807.

The Library has a complete set of New York Directories from 1793 to 1911, but lacks the original issue of the first directory of 1786. Valentine's Manuals for 1841, 1844 and 1848 are lacking and also the New York Session Laws for 1802, 1803, 1819, 1882 to 1885 and 1889 . The Trustees venture to hope that the deficiencies above mentioned may be supplied to the Library through the kindness of its friends.

The Trustees desire to express their thanks to the following ladies and gentlemen for valuable gifts: to Mr J. Pierpont Morgan for the "Catalogue of his collection of Jewels and Precious Works of Art," No. 32, of 150 copies sumptuously bound in levant morocco; to the Honorable C. M. Depew for his "Orations, speeches and addresses" in eight volumes, an autograph copy bound in full leather ; to Mr. Beverly Chew for a copy of "Researches concerning Jean Grolier," published by the Grolier Club, and the "Hudson Fulton celebration," published by the Society of Iconophiles in an edition of ro6 copies; to the Honorable Elihu Root, John Mason Knox, Esq., Mr. James Van Wagenen, Dr. S. H. Carney, Mrs. G. A. Lung, Miss Drisler, Miss A. M. Vail and to others, whose names are recorded in the list of Donors.

During the year, a second volume of Hollyer's Views of old New York and many early guide books of the City have been acquired at very low prices. Additions to the John C. Green Collection of works on the Fine Arts are recorded in the list following the Treasurer's statement.

Through the kind instrumentality of Mr. Beverly Chew, the Secretary of the Board, the most valuable books are stored outside of the Library in fire-proof vaults.

The Trustees cannot close this report without sorrowful reference to the death in September last, of Wentworth Sanborn Butler,
the Librarian Emeritus of the corporation. His faithful and efficient service to the Library began in 1855, and was ended only by his death. For more than fifty years he labored unremittingly and successfully for the Library's benefit. His faithfulness was almost without a parallel and to his efforts it may truthfully be said the Library owes its present financial stability. His gentle and manly personality has left its impress upon this Institution and has endeared his memory to a multitude of friends.
