## REGULATIONS.

1.-Every member who shall not be indebted to the Corporation for any annual payment, or for fines or forfeitures incurred by him or her, and whose name shall be entered in the Treasurer's Register, shall, for every right owned by him or her, be entitled to receive from the Librarian, during the hours appointed for the Library to be open, four works at a time, of which not more than one shall be a new work.

New books may be kept one week only. Other books may be kept three weeks, with the privilege of renewal, unless other members have applied for them.
2. -The ownership of a share shall not give the privileges of the Library to more than one person and to his or her household.

If the ownership is vested in an estate or corporation, the privileges shall be restricted to such person and to his or her immediate household as may be designated by the executors of the estate or by the corporation.
3.-No person, whether member or not, shall lend any book belonging to the corporation to any person out of his dwelling-house.
4.-Any member who shall detain a book longer than the times above limited, respectively, shall forfeit and pay for every day such book shall be detained beyond the time so limited, one cent.
5.- If any member lose or damage a book, he shall make good the same to the Library; and if the book lost or injured be one of a set, he shall pay, to the Treasurer, for the use of the corporation, the value of the entire set, and may thereupon receive for himself the residue of the whole set.
6.-The Librarian may let out books to persons not being members of the corporation, upon such terms and conditions as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Library Committee. But, if a member and a person who is not a member, should apply for the same book at the same time, the member shall have the preference.
7.-A member, besides the books he may be entitled to as a member, may take as many as he pleases on the same terms as persons who are not members.

## ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## Trustees of the New York Society <br> Library

The Trustees of the New York Society Library present to the members this their report for the year ending March 3I, I9I4:

The Treasurer's report submitted herewith, and to which attention is invited, shows that the yearly subscriptions continue to increase. A number of new perpetually free shares have been sold.

The most interesting event of the year has been the recovery of the original parchment charter of the Society Library, granted by George the Third of England in 1772 . It is said to have disappeared sometime between 1840 and 1854 and was restored to the Library in October, 1913, by a resident of Brooklyn, in whose possession it had been for many years. The Trustees are much gratified to have recovered this interesting historical document, as its disappearance had been a frequent subject of conjecture. It is now in a fireproof vault, through the kind instrumentality of Mr. Beverly Chew, Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

It seems to have been the accepted thing for charters of institutions founded before the Revolution to disappear, for in 1848 the Secretary of the New York Chamber of Commerce (which was founded in 1758 ) reported that its charter could not be found although it had been seen twenty-five years before in the old Walton House, preserved in a mahogany case, with a circle at one end, to allow the entry of the old Colonial Seal, and the case was also seen on the night of the great fire.*

[^0]Numerous gifts have been received during the past year. General Rush C. Hawkins has presented a complete set of the publications of the Union League Club, which is said to be the only complete set besides the one in the possession of the club itself. From W Emlen Roosevelt, Esq., were received 88 historical works ; from Henry E. Gregory, Esq., 97 volumes and 121 pamphlets on social science ; from General Nelson H. Henry, 233 historical and medical works, and from Samuel Verplanck Hoffman, Esq., "The Civic Ancestry of New York City and State," one of ten copies specially color blazoned. To Mrs. Robert W de Forest, Miss Mary Drisler, John Leonard, Esq., the Evening Post and others whose names are mentioned in the list of donors, the Trustees desire to express their thanks and appreciation for valuable gifts.

Mr F Augustus Schermerhorn has presented another catalogue case of seventy-five card trays in continuation of his previous generous gift.

A list of Shareholders, Trustees and Officers of the Society Library with photographs of all the Chairmen of the Trustees and pictures of all the Society Library buildings at different periods, has recently been published. No list of Shareholders had been printed since 188I before this.

The desirability of limiting the number of Shareholders to r,ooo has been discussed by members of the Board of Trustees. The experience of clubs and membership libraries has shown that a limited membership tends to increase the appreciation of shares.

The Trustees are gratified to be able to report a year of progress, at a time when business depression has been prevalent.
