## REGULATIONS.

1.-Every member who shall not be indebted to the Corporation for any annual payment, or for fines or forfeitures incurred by him or her, and whose name shall be entered in the Treasurer's Register, shall, for every right owned by him or her, be entitled to receive from the Librarian, during the hours appointed for the Library to be open, four works at a time, of which not more than one shall be a new work.

New books may be kept one week only. Other books may be kept three weeks, with the privilege of renewal, unless other members have applied for them.
2. - The ownership of a share shall not give the privileges of the Library to more than one person and to his or her household.

If the ownership is vested in an estate or corporation, the privileges shall be restricted to such person and to his or her immediate household as may be designated by the executors of the estate or by the corporation.
3.-No person, whether member or not, shall lend any book belonging to the corporation to any person out of his dwelling-house.
4.-Any member who shall detain a book longer than the times above limited, respectively, shall forfeit and pay for every day such book shall be detained beyond the time so limited, one cent.
5.-If any member lose or damage a book, he shall make good the same to the Library; and if the book lost or injured be one of a set, he shall pay, to the Treasurer, for the use of the corporation, the value of the entire set, and may thereupon receive for himself the residue of the whole set.
6.-The Librarian may let out books to persons not being members of the corporation, upon such terms and conditions as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Library Committee. But, if a member and a person who is not a member, should apply for the same book at the same time, the member shall have the preference.
7.-A member, besides the books he may be entitled to as a member, may take as many as he pleases on the same terms as persons who are not members.

# ANNUAL REPORT 

OF THE

## Trustees of the New York Society Library.

The Trustees of the New York Society Library present to the members this their report for the year ending March 31, 1915.

The Treasurer's report, submitted herewith, and to which attention is invited, shows continued prosperity throughout a year of widespread business depression. Our annual subscriptions, which have been steadily growing during the past fifteen years, show a gratifying increase for the year just ended.

The Library supplies the following clubs with books: The Calumet, Century, Colony, Columbia University, Harvard, Metropolitan, Princeton, Racquet and Tennis, Union, Union League, University and Yale. It also supplies several private schools in New York City and elsewhere. Any of our members who belong to clubs which they wish to have supplied with books from the Society Library should apply to the Librarian.

Members frequently inquire if they can take out subscriptions for their relatives and friends who live outside of New York City and can have books delivered by parcel post in the winter time as well as in the summer. The Trustees have pleasure in announcing that books may be sent by parcel post or by express at any time of the year, and the Library already has a considerable and growing circulation in many other States.

The design of the Society Library is to do things in a different way from other libraries and in a better way. Its shelves are open to members; it has the only free delivery system of library books in the city; it has its own style of book cover and puts a new cover on a book each time it leaves the shelf; it is more concerned in getting books out promptly than in getting them
back, believing that books are made to be used and not to ornament the shelves. Its rules and regulations are kept in the background and brought to attention discreetly and only when necessary. In the purchasing of books it is guided chiefly by thought of what the members want to read and not by what some one thinks they ought to read. The result is that not only the casual reader is pleased but that serious students of history and literature have taken pains to commend the Society Library as the ideal library for students.

Our report for igio quoted the words of the well-known author of the "History of New York in the Seventeenth Century," expressing gratitude for the unusual facilities afforded. In an address "On the Trend of Modern Literature," delivered before the New York State Library Association last fall, Louise Collier Willcox said: "I know of three libraries in the world that attain the ideal conditions, The Bodleian Library in Oxford, England, The New York Society Library and the Bryn Mawr College Library, and all of these libraries are ideal because of the sympathetic understanding of their librarians. I have belonged to this library (the Society Library) for some two years, and in so far as I have been able to find out, there are no rules at all. When you want books which are not there, they buy them. When they have to send to Germany or England they notify you that the book will be sent for and gotten in such and such a time. As far as I can find out there is no red tape. I call them and have books sent-or I can order them mailed or expressed. I pay ten dollars a year for these privileges, but if the price were to be multiplied ten times, I should go without hats and shoes and still subscribe to the New York Society Library as I advise all my friends to do."

The Trustees are indebted to Charles F. Williams, Esq., who lent to the Library for exhibition his pre-Revolutionary antislavery pamphlets, written chiefly by his ancestor, Anthony Benezet, and said to be the largest known collection. Howard Townsend, Esq., has presented three interesting documents relating to the Library's early history. Privately printed genealogies were given by Mrs. Robert W. de Forest, Mrs. Frederic R. Lefferts, Mrs. Henry Cotheal Swords and Miss Grace C. Clark-
son. Gen. Rush C. Hawkins has presented copies of his valuable "Catalogue of Books by the First Printers" and "Catalogue of his Collection of Paintings," together with several volumes of his own writings. Valuable gifts of books were also received from Beverly Chew, Esq., W Emlen Roosevelt, Esq., John Mason Knox, Esq., Dr. F. Spencer Halsey, Miss Mary Drisler, Mrs. G. A. Lung, Mrs. W Gerry Slade, and many others. To all of these ladies and gentlemen the Trustees offer their grateful acknowledgment.

The history of the year, unhappily, cannot be closed without a record of the incalculable loss the Library has suffered by the death of George Winthrop Folsom, a faithful and efficient trustee, a man of honor, ability, breadth and cultivation, gentle in blood, and gentle, warm hearted and altogether delightful by nature, a man who during the long term of his trusteeship had won and held the respect, admiration and friendship of all his associates. "About such a life as his," has said one of his friends, "it is easy to write commonplaces, but there is nothing commonplace in it. When it ends, it does not leave wonderment behind it, or a sense of the insecurity of fame, but a solid satisfaction and happiness in the memory of a rare achievement-a feeling that we have seen a manly task accomplished, not for the sake of ambition and renown, or victory among giants, but as we should each one of us like to think of our own being done."
