# New Events Registration System

The Library is proud to introduce a new system for adult event registration that makes it easy to register and pay for events online. All you need is your membership name, <u>your barcode</u>, and a credit card or PayPal account for fee events. #### To Register Online

1. Go to the Library's Calendar of Events.

2. Click on the event you'd like to attend and click the **Register** button.

3. Input your membership name and <u>barcode</u> in the Patron Verification screen.

4. Input the number in your party in the Reservation Number field.

6. Click Submit and you're registered!

The **Program Confirmation** screen will appear. You will also receive an automatic e-mail confirmation to the address associated with your membership.

To pay fees for your events:

If you are registering for multiple events with fees, please complete your registrations, then pay the total fees.

1. In the Program Confirmation screen, click the Pay Fees button.

2. Input your total fees in the Unit Price field.

3. Log in to your PayPal account or input your credit card information.

In 1980, Alice Gore King donated 588 letters to the Houghton Library at Harvard University. The letters had been written by Edith Kermit Roosevelt to Miss King's mother, Marion King, between 1920 and 1947. Mrs. Roosevelt was the wife of

Theodore Roosevelt, the 26th President of the United States. Marion King was, for almost fifty years, a staff member at The New York Society Library. This treasury of letters documents the littleknown friendship between the President's wife and the Librarian.

This exhibition has been extended through March 1. Take advantage of a unique opportunity to experience a First Lady's literary tastes and a touching story of friendship.





Although she was dubbed the Dragon Lady in some quarters, she was an icon to her people and is certainly one of the most remarkable women of the twentieth century.
