How do I find the best airfare deals online?



- 1. Book in advance.
- 2. Fly on a weekday.
- 3. Check multiple websites. Today's best deal may be found on one site one day, and another site the next.
- 4. Check sites often (but not for too long!), if booking far in advance.
- 5. Subscribe to email alerts, podcasts or RSS feeds.

- 1. Book in advance.
- 2. Read hotel reviews from online guides.
- 3. Read personal hotel reviews from other travelers.
- 4. Check prices on various search sites, including the hotel's site.
