

# **Project MUSE**


## Scholarly journals online

#### What is Project MUSE?

Project MUSE is a searchable database providing full-text online access to current content from over 400 high quality humanities and social sciences journals from over 90 scholarly publishers. It covers literature and criticism, history, the visual and performing arts, cultural studies, education, political science, gender studies, and others.

#### How do you access Project MUSE?

Project MUSE is available through the Library's online catalog: <a href="http://library.nysoclib.org/">http://library.nysoclib.org/</a>. To access the database, either search for "Project MUSE" as a title or author in the catalog, or choose "Project MUSE" from the list of Electronic Resources at the bottom left of the Library catalog's main page. Here is the online catalog's record for Project MUSE.




Project MUSE can be accessed by Library members inside and outside the library. If you are using a computer inside the library to connect to Project MUSE, choose the "**in library**" link to access the database. Once clicked, the Project MUSE main page will appear on the screen.


If you are at home or elsewhere outside the Library, choose the "outside library" link. The "outside library" link will take you to a login in page asking for your Member Name and Barcode. You can get your patron barcode by asking at the Circulation Desk, calling the Library at 212-288-6900, or emailing <a href="mailto:systems@nysoclib.org">systems@nysoclib.org</a> with your membership name and the subject "Barcode Request." Once logged in to the Library's system, the Project MUSE main page will appear on the screen.




